

# Hayhurst Neighborhood Association

A Little Bit of the Country in the City

In the late 19<sup>th</sup> century, Hayhurst neighborhood was originally family-owned farms, which also included many dairies. Farmers had to travel many miles on muddy roads to bring their produce or dairy product to the growing city of Portland. The Red Electric Railroad came through the neighborhood in 1869 and helped increase access to the city.

The neighborhood was largely rural until after World War II. Hayhurst's development into a suburban

neighborhood took place in the 1950's & 60's. Hayhurst School was built in 1954 to educate the young Baby Boomers whose parents had moved into the

neighborhood. Over the past 60 years, four generations of neighborhood residents have had family members attend Hayhurst School. Pendleton Park was developed next to the school and provides the neighborhood with acres of open space.
